### UNATTENDED CHILDREN POLICY

The safety and well being of young children left unattended at the library is of serious concern. Young preschool children, especially, left alone may become frightened or anxious. Older children cannot be expected to deal with a small child who is frightened, tired, or ill. Library staff have many public duties and cannot serve as babysitters. The Library is a public place. Child abduction in public places, including the Library, is a real danger.

Consequently, the Library's policy states:

**Parents or responsible adult caregivers, not library staff, are responsible for the behavior of their children using the library. Parents will be notified if their children are left unattended and require supervision. If parents or caregivers are unavailable, PROPER AUTHORITIES WILL BE NOTIFIED.**

Please note that this policy applies to all children under the age of 18. Proper authorities include the police and the sheriff's department.

We ask your cooperation in making the library a safe and happy place for your children.
