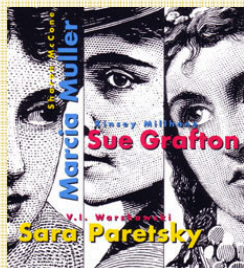
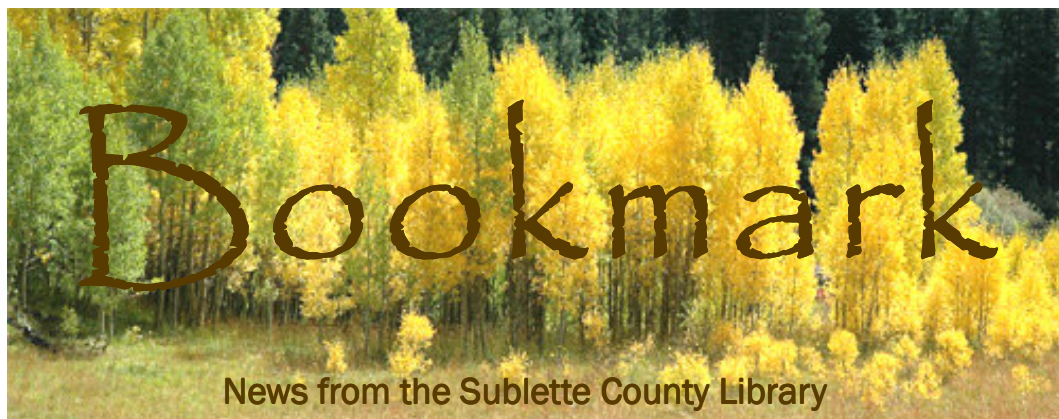

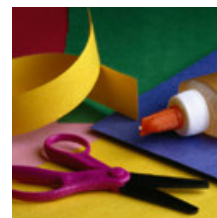

## Building Update

Rocky Mountain Power recently granted the library \$20,000 to pay for the photovoltaic system on the south side of the new expansion as part of their Blue Skies Project. Rocky Mountain Power provides funding to support community-based renewable energy projects across the company's service area, increasing the generation of electricity from sources such as wind and solar energy.



Photovoltaic cells will allow sunlight to be harnessed on the south side of the library's new wing and converted to electricity.

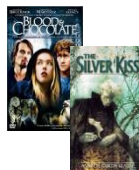
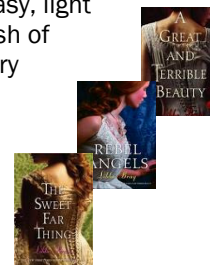

- ***Tithe: A Modern Faerie Tale*** (book 1)
- ***Valiant: A Modern Tale of Faerie*** (book 2)
- ***Ironside: A Modern Faery's Tale*** (book 3)



For an interesting combination of fantasy, light horror, and historical fiction, with a dash of romance thrown in for good measure try Libba Bray's:

- ***Great and Terrible Beauty*** (1)
- ***Rebel Angels*** (2)
- ***Sweet Far Thing*** (3)



Although these are not a series, Annette Klaus writes about teen werewolves—***Blood and Chocolate*** and vampires—***The Silver Kiss***.
