## Smithsonian Comes to the Library: Between Fences

Sept. 22 – Nov. 10, 2007

Between Fences is an exhibit on the cultural history of fences and land use. It examines how neighbors and nations divide and protect, offend and defend through the boundaries they build. This exhibition will surprise audiences with its exploration of the multiple meanings behind this everyday icon.

There will be many activities associated with this event. Two that will be happening this summer are:

### Fence Post Art Show

Pick up a fence post at the libraries in Pinedale or Big Piney and you or your organization can paint it, decorate it, do whatever arty thing you can think of to it and it will be put with others to create a uniquely Pinedale work of art. You can also use your own fence post. Fence posts are available at either library. **Finished works of art must be delivered to either library by July 19th.**

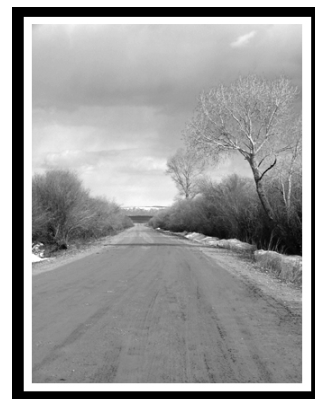

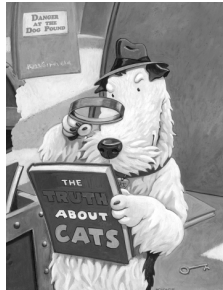
